



SDG ART COMPETITION 2023

“Food for All”

- **Around 700-800 MILLION people in the world go to bed hungry every night.**
- **It’s estimated one person dies of hunger every 4-12 seconds.**
- **Yet we waste about one third of all the food we produce.**
- **How can we make food fairer for everyone?**

There is enough food in the world to feed everyone but the way we grow, trade and use it means it is not shared very equally. This competition, based on the UN Sustainable Development Goal 2: Zero Hunger, asks to you think about what action we can take to make sure everyone gets enough food to be healthy, wherever they are in the world. Just by entering the competition you will be helping others as Shoprite will kindly donate £1 to the Isle of Man Foodbank for every entry received*.

Who can enter?

The competition is open to anyone living on the Isle of Man.

What do I need to do?

There are two classes of entry:

Under 18s: Entrants are asked to design a poster on the theme “Food for All” that promotes positive action we can take about hunger. Entries should be drawings, paintings or illustrations no larger than A3 in size. There will be three prizes in this category with the overall winner receiving a selection of art materials kindly donated by WH Smith and two smaller runner up prizes.

18 & Over: Entrants are asked to produce an artwork in response to the theme. There is no restriction on the type of artwork in this class although it must be easy to move and store! There will be a prize of £100 in vouchers kindly donated by Shoprite for the overall winner in this category, with smaller prizes for most creative use of materials and best call to action.

Judging:

Entries will be judged by a panel including One World Centre Trustees and a representative from the Isle of Man Arts Council using the following criteria:

- Creative expression
- Understanding of and relevance to the theme
- Impact

Some things to think about:

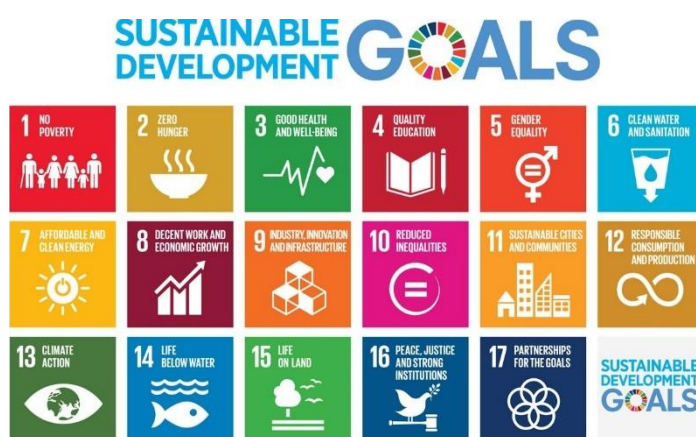
