



GLOBAL VILLAGE – MONDAY 7TH JULY 2025

Terms & Conditions for stall holders

The Global Village is put on by the One World Centre (Manx Registered Charity No. 1192) and takes place as part of the Isle of Man's Tynwald Day celebrations. We are lucky to be allowed the use of the National Arboretum and to ensure a safe and enjoyable event there are some conditions that we all need to keep to:

1. Stalls may be erected from Sunday 6th July 2025 from 2pm however we do not recommend leaving valuable items overnight. These are left at your own risk.
2. The ground in the Arboretum is low lying and can be very soft. For this reason we have to plan as though no vehicles can come into the area. Nearer the time, a map will be given to you showing your position and the entrances to the site.
3. On Sunday it is possible to park in the Arboretum carpark in order to be able to bring things onto the site. This car park is reserved on Monday and must not be used by stall holders.
4. We are expecting the roads around the Arboretum to close at 09:00 on Monday morning so all goods need to be offloaded by that time. Limited vehicles can be parked in the allocated stall holder's car park and it is hoped that one parking permit will be issued per stall.
5. When unloading and reloading your goods, vehicles must be parked in a sensible place and must not block the access roads.
6. Dismantling of stalls should not commence before 4pm on the day unless permission is given by the One World Centre.
7. Stall holders are requested to encourage silence during the Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial.
8. It is the responsibility of all standholders to comply with relevant Isle of Man Trading Standards and Environmental Health Legislation. in respect of stands, exhibits and merchandise.

9. CATERING STALLS & VEHICLES

All catering stalls and vehicles must be registered with DEFA, provide copies of adequate Public Liability Insurance Certificate (and Maintenance or Fire Safety Certificate where applicable) and a risk assessment. Good hygiene should be maintained at all times and allergens clearly stated.

10. GENERATORS

There is no access to mains electricity for stallholders in the Arboretum. We would prefer to avoid the use of generators wherever possible and consent must be obtained from the One World Centre if a stallholder wishes to use a generator.

Where a generator is permitted, it must be silenced and fully comply with current Health & Safety Regulations. A copy of the last certificate of inspection must be provided along with a certificate of insurance. It should be placed in an area where it will not cause any noise

disturbance or any Health & Safety issues to other stall holders or to members of the public. If the generator is noisy or develops a fault during the day and the noise is unacceptable, an official will request that it shall be turned off and, if necessary, close down the stall. For catering stallholders only, a shared generator arrangement may be possible. Please ask for more information.

11. Firecrackers, sky lanterns, helium balloons, aerosols of crazy string and replica firearms are not permitted. No alcohol is allowed for sale or to be given out as prizes at the event.

12. **Recyclable materials/single use plastic.** Stallholders are required to supply/use recyclable containers/cups/glasses etc. No single-use plastics are permitted.

13. Each stall holder must make provision for the litter around his/her stall to be taken away. (Failure to remove litter could result in applications for stalls in future years being rejected.)

14. The One World Centre provides only the space in the Arboretum. It is the responsibility of the stall holder to provide the stall(s) and any equipment needed. No responsibility for the stall(s) or the goods thereon is accepted by the One World Centre.

15. Stallholders erecting a Gazebo/Tent must ensure that no ropes or fixings become trip hazards.

16. The Police have requested that all stall holders on Tynwald Day should be advised that under no circumstances should they park their cars on any of the approach roads to the Fair Field, particularly Station Road, as these cause very considerable traffic obstructions.

17. Allocation of stalls will be carried out by the One World Centre, and the decision on the allocation is final.

18. The Global Village is a family-friendly celebration of cultural diversity, the environment and sustainable development on the Island and we expect all stallholders to abide by the spirit of the event. The One World Centre reserves the right to remove any materials deemed offensive and/or to require stallholders who contravene this terms and conditions to leave if necessary.

19. We will be taking photos of the event during the day and these may be used for future publicity purposes. Should you not wish your stall/stallholders to be photographed by the One World Centre please let us know in advance.
