ACCOUNTS AND DIRECTORS RESPONSIBILITIES

The Company is an Audit Exempt Company within the meaning of the Companies (Audit Exemption) Regulations 2007 and has therefore dispensed with the necessity to appoint Auditors for the year. In place of an audit an independent examination has been carried out. Any member may give notice in writing to the company, at its registered office, requiring an audit to be carried

3. IoM Government's development education grant of £30,000 runs for one year from 1.9.24.
4. The Welcome Project is a joint venture between OWC and Cafe Lingo, and is funded by the Manx Lottery Trust. Since the OWC is the official grant holder and legal employer, income and expenditure are included in these accounts.
