SDG POSTER COMPETITION 2026



Prizes for primary and secondary ages!

Create a poster that encourages people to look after our land and everything that lives on it

- ✦ Forests cover over 31% of earth's land... but we continue to chop down trees for agriculture and urban development at an alarming rate.
- ✦ Almost all plant life lives on land and plants make up around 80% of our diets.
- ✦ 2.6bn people depend on agriculture for their livelihoods.
- ✦ Climate change is already affecting life on land.
- ✦ Nature and a healthy environment are essential for humans to survive!

What do I need to do? Design a poster, no larger than A3 in size, calling for action to look after our land and everything that lives on it. You can concentrate on one aspect eg deforestation, animals, farming or choose to talk about Life on Land more broadly. Digital entries can be entered but no AI-generated artwork will be accepted.

Who can enter? The competition is open to anyone of school age on the Isle of Man. There are two classes of entry: primary school age and secondary school age.

Prizes: The winner of each class will receive a prize of creative vouchers to the value of £50. There will also be prizes of £25 in creative vouchers for the two runners up in each class.

Judging: Judges will be appointed by the One World Centre and will consider creative impact and understanding of - and relevance to - the theme.

Life on Land is one of the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals. These are goals that have been adopted by 193 countries around the world to help us create a fairer world that looks after the planet for future generations.

Goal 15: restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss.
